3.2 Eivind Rindal: Democracy and the freedom of speech. Wants the government to fight for people's rights. In two years time, vote the government out!

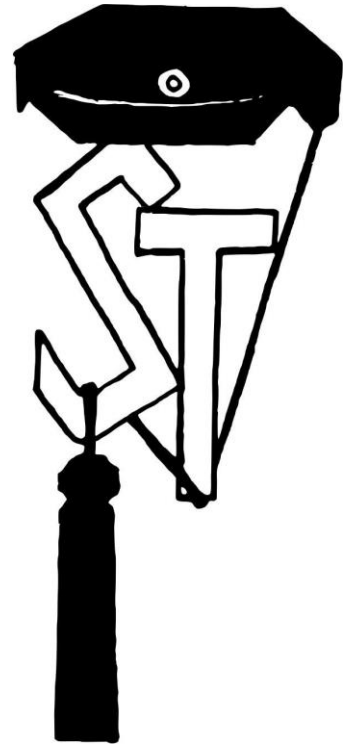
4. Introduction from the committee for the expansion of the Student Society's building




